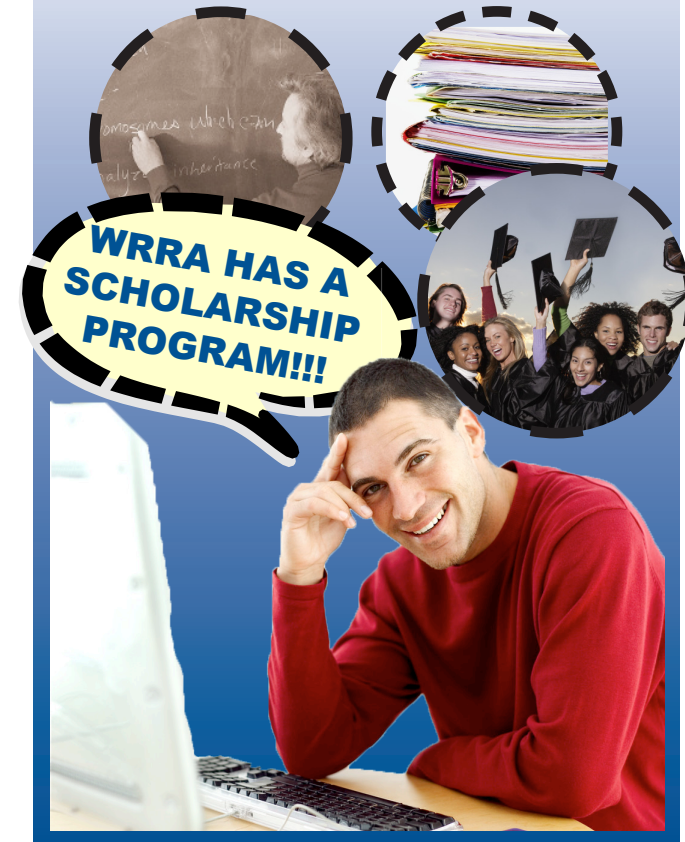

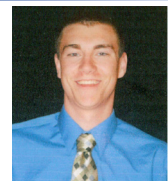

## THE PROGRAM

The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association has established a scholarship program to assist employees and their dependent children who plan to continue education in college or vocational school programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship Management Services®, a division of Scholarship America®. Scholarship Management Services is the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship and tuition reimbursement programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

## ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Washington Refuse & Recycling Association Scholarship Program must be:

- Employees or dependent\* children of employees of regular member companies of the Washington Refuse & Recycling Association, as defined by the Washington Refuse & Recycling Association bylaws.

\*Dependent children are defined as natural and legally adopted children or stepchildren, under the age of 24, living in the employee's household or primarily supported by the employee.

- High school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll or students who are already enrolled in a full-time\*\* undergraduate course of study at an

accredited two-year or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school. Employees may attend school part-time.

\*\*Full-time study is defined as full-time enrollment for the entire upcoming academic year.

## AWARDS

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a \$2,000 award. Up to four (4) awards will be granted each year. Awards are not renewable, but students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

## APPLICATION

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship Management Services, postmarked no later than March 1. Grade reports are not acceptable. Online transcripts must display student name, school name, grade and credit hours earned for each course, and term in which each course was taken. Applicants will receive acknowledgment of receipt of their application. If an acknowledgment card is not received within three weeks, applicants may call Scholarship Management Services to verify that the application has been received.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Instructions for completing the Financial Data section of the application are included. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. All information received is considered

confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship Management Services.

## SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal. Financial need of \$2,000 or greater must be demonstrated for the student to receive an award.

Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship Management Services. In no instance does any officer or employee of The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision of Scholarship Management Services as final.

Applicants will be notified in mid-April. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients. Students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

## PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship Management Services processes scholarship payments on behalf of the Washington Refuse & Recycling Association. Payments are made on August 15. A check will be mailed to each recipient's home address and is made payable to the school for the student.
