# The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association Scholarship Program

---

## THE PROGRAM

The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association has established a scholarship program to assist employees and their dependent children who plan to continue education in college or vocational school programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship America®, the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship, tuition assistance and other education support programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

## ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association Scholarship Program must be -

- Employees or dependent\* children of employees, of regular member companies and their affiliates of The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association, as defined by The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association bylaws,

*\*Dependent children are defined as natural and legally adopted children or stepchildren, under the age of 24, living in the employee's household or primarily supported by the employee.*

- High school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll or students who are already enrolled in full-time undergraduate study at an accredited two-year or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school for the entire upcoming academic year. Employees may attend school part-time.

## AWARDS

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a \$2,000 award. Up to four (4) awards will be granted each year. Awards are not renewable, but students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

Awards are for undergraduate study only.

## APPLICATION

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship America postmarked no later than **April 30**. Grade reports are not acceptable. Unofficial transcripts must display student name, school name, grade and credit hours earned for each course, and term in which each course was taken. Applicants will receive acknowledgment of receipt of their application. If an acknowledgment email is not received within three weeks, applicants may call Scholarship America to verify that the application has been received.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Instructions for completing the Financial Data section of the application are included. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. All information received is considered confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship America.

## **SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS**

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal. Financial need must be demonstrated for the student to receive an award.

Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship America. In no instance does any officer or employee of The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final.

Applicants will be notified in May. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients. Students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

## **PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS**

Scholarship America processes scholarship payments on behalf of The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association. Payments are made in August.

---

## **OBLIGATIONS**

Recipients have no obligation to The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association. They are, however, required to notify Scholarship America of any changes in address, school enrollment, or other relevant information and to send a complete transcript when requested.

---

## **REVISIONS**

The Washington Refuse & Recycling Association reserves the right to review the conditions and procedures of this scholarship program and to make changes at any time including termination of the program.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE FINANCIAL DATA SECTION OF THE APPLICATION

---

The Financial Data section of the application should be completed by the employee.

1. **State of Residence** is the state where the parents and/or (independent) applicant reside and pay state income tax.
2. **Adjusted Gross Income** can be found on IRS FORM 1040 and is gross income reduced by specific adjustments allowed by law.
3. **Total Federal Tax Paid** includes the total amount of **federal** income tax to be paid as reported on IRS FORM 1040. This is **not** the amount withheld from employee's paychecks. (The amount withheld should be adjusted by any refund or additional taxes due.) Do **not** report state income tax.
4. **Total Income** of parent(s) should be reported individually if applicant is a dependent student, or by the applicant if independent. Provide information for both natural parents, when possible. **If the student resides with only one parent**, financial information **must** be received from the employee or member of the company sponsoring the scholarship program **and** the parent who claims the child as a dependent for tax purposes. If a parent has remarried, the spouse's information is required if the spouse is a legal guardian of the student, or claims the student as a dependent, or the student is included in the spouse's benefit plan. **If necessary, two Financial Data sections may be submitted by the student.** A copy of the Financial Data section may be made in order for one to be completed by each parent.
5. **Total number of family members living in the household** and primarily supported by the reported income may include:
  - the applicant
  - the applicant's parents
  - other children living in the household
  - dependent college students living away from home
  - other people who live in the household and receive more than half of their support from the reported income
6. **Marital status** is the current status of the person from whom the financial information is submitted.
7. **Of the total number of family members on line 5, number of students attending college** includes family members attending a two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school at least half-time. Include the applicant in this number. Do not include parents.

**NOTE:** Any exceptions to providing financial information as instructed above must be submitted to Scholarship America in writing.
